Cowhands

When people imagine cowhands, they often think about what they have seen in the movies. However, the ranching industry has changed over the years, affecting cowhands' work. Long ago, ranches spread over large areas, with cattle roaming over open ranges. Cowhands from various ranches would work together during roundups. They would brand the new calves and sell the older cattle.

Today's Cowhands

Today's cowhands admit that new inventions have made their jobs much less difficult. Most ranches are much smaller. The ranches also use barbed wire fences to keep the cattle from getting lost. Although cowhands continue to ride horses, they more often drive trucks around the ranches. Cattle can be transported from place to place using trains and large trailers. This ensures that the trip to different regions of the country is much faster. Cowhands, who once spent lengthy periods of time on the trail with the cattle, can now spend more time at home with their families.


Even the cowhands' attire has transformed over time. Cowhands used to wear clothes that were discarded by other people. They wore any kind of hat with a wide brim that would prevent the sun from blinding their eyes. It was not until the 1900s that cowhands wore a felt hat, a large belt buckle, and pointed boots. Today's cowhands generally wear jeans, a brightly colored shirt, work boots, and a baseball cap. As they say, clothes make the man, and the felt hat remains a symbol of cowhand life.

How to Care for a Felt Cowhand Hat

Many cowhand hats are constructed from felt, a light and smooth fabric. Felt is made by using hot water and steam to press together short, single fibers. It is a terrific fabric for hats because it lasts a long time. To keep a felt cowhand hat looking good, there are some important steps to follow.

- Always place your hat on a flat surface. Turn it upside down so that it is resting on its crown, which is the top of the hat. Never rest it on its brim because the brim could be flattened and lose its shape.
- Avoid leaving your hat in a place that gets particularly hot, such as a heater. You should also avoid places that are humid, such as the bathroom when you are taking a shower. If the hat gets too hot or there is too much moisture in the air, the sweatband, which is the part that makes your hat fit your head, will likely shrink.
- Sometimes your sweatband will get wet from perspiration or your hat will get wet from bad weather, such as rain, sleet, or snow. If this happens, remove your hat, and then flip up the sweatband in order to allow it to dry. This will stop the water from soaking into your hat. Wait for the sweatband or hat to air dry. Never try to rush the drying process by using something like a hair dryer. The heat will damage the hat.
