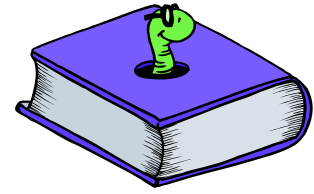

Goldie Socks was persistent because she kept looking for different books and places to read. She didn't give up until she found something just right.

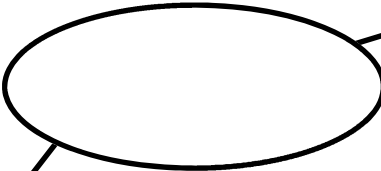
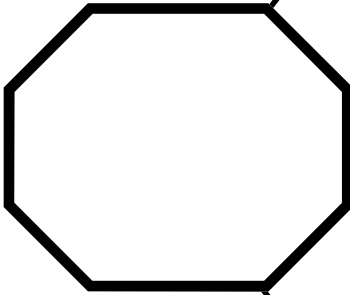

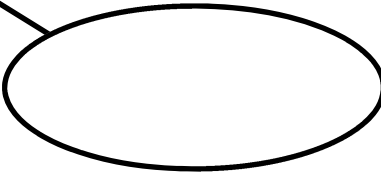
